

VILLAGE OF OBETZ RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

REGULAR MEETING OF FEBRUARY 25, 2013

The Obetz Village Council met in regular session on February 25, 2013 at 6:00 PM in Council Chambers with Mayor D. Greg Scott presiding.

Roll Call

Mayor Scott called the roll with all six members of Council present: Mrs. Bonnie Wiley, Mr. James Wiley, Mrs. Louise Crabtree, Mr. John Souders, Mr. Michael Flaherty, and Mr. James Triplett. Also present were E. Rod Davisson, Administrator; Eugene Hollins, Solicitor; Kenneth Hinkle, Chief of Police; and, Stacey Boumis, Community Services Director/Council Clerk.

Mayor Scott called for a motion to excuse Mr. Triplett from the February 11, 2013 meeting. Motion made by Mrs. Crabtree; seconded by Mrs. Wiley. Voting as follows: Mrs. Wiley – yes; Mr. Wiley – yes; Mr. Souders – yes; Mr. Flaherty– yes; Mrs. Crabtree – yes; Mr. Triplett - abstain. Motion carried.

Emergencies

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 13-13 An Ordinance To Authorize The Administrator To Enter Into A Partial Assignment Of The Toy Road Community Reinvestment Area Agreement By And Between The Village Of Obetz And Centerpoint Investment, LLC And Declaring An Emergency. Mr. Davisson discussed the ordinance. Mrs. Crabtree moved to suspend the rules regarding the adoption of Ordinance 13-13; seconded by Mrs. Wiley. Voting as

Standing Committee Reports

Recreation and Health – Mr. Souders stated the Obetz Health Fair has been scheduled for May 3rd at the senior center. A youth track club is starting in the spring. Mr. Flaherty announced that the sixth grade basketball team that he coaches won the Central Ohio Basketball Association Division III championship tournament. He further stated that the travel basketball program should be expanded to 5th and 6th grade girls and boys.

Public Utilities – Mr. Flaherty stated the 96 gallon trash containers have been distributed and the water bills have been sent out in the new format.

Safety and Streets – Mr. Flaherty stated that he is concerned about vehicles making right turns on red onto Alum Creek Drive from Groveport Road.

Planning and Zoning Commission – Mrs. Wiley asked if the information regarding coyotes could be put on the back of the next water bill. Mr. Flaherty stated that residents in Butler Farms are concerned about the fence regulations and would like different standards.

Eugene Hollins, Solicitor – Mr. Hollins requested an executive session to discuss personnel discipline.

Kenneth Hinkle, Police Chief – Chief Hinkle stated that Officer Smith will be solo beginning February 27th. He further stated that he is conducting a safety drill at Hamilton High School on March 6th.

E. Rod Davisson, Esq., Administrator – Mr. Davisson stated that the current police patch looks like Columbus' police patch. The new police patch is a way to distinguish ourselves.
