AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO MAKE PAYMENT ON A CONTRACT WITH THE FRANKLIN COUNTY TREASURER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Franklin County Treasurer collects property taxes for properties within the Village of Obetz; and

WHEREAS, Property taxes are paid in the current year for prior year taxes; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Obetz acquired property in 2015, by purchase and/or donation; and

WHEREAS, after these services were rendered, the Village received an invoice for which a purchase order, with a prior certification of availability of funds by the Village Director of Finance attached, had been obtained but wishes to reallocate the costs; and

WHEREAS, Section 5705.41 (D)(1) of the Ohio Revised Code provides that in certain circumstances a subdivision may authorize payment on a contract executed without prior certification by the subdivision's Director of Finance; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council now has before it a certificate from the Director of Finance certifying there was at the time of the making of that contract and at the time of the execution of such certificate a sufficient sum appropriated for the purpose of such contract and in the treasury or in process of collection to the credit of an appropriate fund free from any encumbrances (a "then and now certificate"); and

WHEREAS, less than thirty days have passed since the Village Council's receipt of the certificate from the Director of Finance; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to satisfy the obligation of that contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF OBETZ, OHIO, THAT:

<u>Section 1</u>. Village Council hereby acknowledges receipt of a "then and now certificate" from the Director of Finance, and authorizes and directs the Director of Finance to make payment not to exceed the amount of \$26,597.87 payable to Franklin County Treasurer.

<u>Section 2</u>. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, such emergency arising from the need to comply with statutory timelines concerning "then and now certificates"; WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
