REGULAR MEETING OF APRIL 24, 2017

The Obetz Village Council met in regular session on April 24, 2017 at 6:00 PM at the Obetz Government Center located at 4175 Alum Creek Drive with Mayor D. Greg Scott presiding.

ROLL CALL

Mayor Scott called the roll with five members of Council present: Mrs. Bonnie Wiley, Mr. James Wiley, Mr. Michael Flaherty, Mrs. Louise Crabtree, and Mrs. Angela Kirk. Also present were E. Rod Davisson, Village Administrator; Brian Jeffers, Police Sergeant; Stephen J. Smith, Esq., and Stacey Boumis, Clerk of Council.

Mayor Scott called for a motion to excuse Mr. Richardson. Motion made by Mr. Wiley; seconded by Mrs. Kirk. Voting as follows: Mrs. Kirk—yes; Mrs. Wiley—yes; Mr. Wiley—yes; Mrs. Crabtree — yes; Mr. Flaherty—yes.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

ORDINANCES

FIRST READINGS

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 21-17: An Ordinance Terminating the OPWC Frusta/McGaw Fund (4908), The Toy Road Curb Cut Fund (4909), The Health Reimbursement Arrangement Fund (6901), And The Engineering Civil Review And Inspection Fund (9902).

SECOND READINGS

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 15-17: An Ordinance To Rezone 2149 McGaw Road (Parcel Number 152-001449) From Exceptional Use To Planned Industrial District. Mayor Scott stated that this issue is still being discussed by the Planning and Zoning Commission. Once the Planning and Zoning Commission take action, Council can schedule a public hearing.

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 16-17: An Ordinance To Rezone Parcels Along Williams Road And Designate Parcels To Be Included In The Williams Road Overlay District And Declaring An Emergency. Mayor Scott stated that this issue is still being discussed by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 17 - 17: An Ordinance Amending Chapter 1161 Of The Codified Ordinances To Create The Williams Road Overlay And Modify The Alum Creek Drive Overlay and Junction Center Overlay And Declaring An Emergency. Mayor Scott stated that this issue is still being discussed by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Ms. Boumis read Ordinance 19-17: An Ordinance Authorizing The Mayor To Execute Necessary Conveyance Documentation To Acquire Approximately 0.24 Acres, More Or Less, Fee Simple Interest In The Property Located At 1816 Arcadia Avenue. Mr. Davisson discussed the ordinance. He stated that the Village is getting property from the land bank.
